Indicate which of the following categories apply to you:

- Frequent changes of school
- Peer conflict
- Interstate transfer during Year 11 or 12
- Limited school participation due to family and/or cultural background
- Trauma (e.g. victim of crime)

Steps Required

1. Indicate which of the following documents you have supplied in support of your application:

- Frequent changes of school Letter from each school attended
- Peer conflict Report from police or report from doctor or psychologist
- Limited school participation due to cultural background Letter from community support group or refugee advocacy group or Department of Communities or Red Cross and/or UNHCR refugee registration
- Interstate transfer during Year 11 or 12 Letter from each school attended
- Trauma Letter from relevant professional or court or police documents.

Additionally it will strongly support your application if you provide academic results (e.g. school reports, academic transcripts) that demonstrate a decrease in achievement as a result of your circumstances

2. Personal Statement

You must provide a statement briefly describing the way in which your education has been adversely affected by your disrupted schooling. You must provide a separate personal statement for each EAS category for which you apply.

3. Educational Support Statement

You must ensure that your education provider completes an *Educational Support Statement*. Please note that only one statement is required regardless of how many categories you nominate.

DOCUMENTATION

It is your responsibility to ensure correct documentation is submitted in support of your EAS application
EAS applications that are not appropriately documented cannot be considered
