

INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE (IB) DIPLOMAS COMPLETED IN 2007

Across Australia, a common national measure of Year 12 student achievement is used in the tertiary selection process. Expressed in a scale extending from 99.95 (highest) down to 30.00, this common national measure is called the UAI in NSW and ACT, the ENTER in Victoria, and the TER in all other states and territories of Australia. The score out of 45 from the completed IB Diploma is also expressed in this common national measure. Termed the 'Combined Rank', the following table shows the common national measures assigned to each of the IB scores attainable in a completed 2007 IB Diploma and the relevant QTAC rank.
